

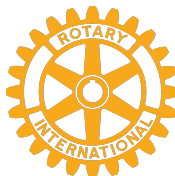

1. GENERAL OVERVIEW

The “**I Rotary Football Talent Camp Spain Atlético de Madrid Edition**” is an international youth football camp organized under the framework of Rotary International Youth Exchange - Short Term Exchange (STE / CAMP).

The camp is promoted by Rotary Club Almendralejo (District 2201, Spain) and is designed to combine high-level football training, international cultural exchange, personal development, and Rotary values in a safe, structured, and professionally supervised environment.

This two-week camp brings together young football players from around the world to experience Spanish football culture, train with professional methodologies, and participate in educational and social activities aligned with Rotary’s commitment to youth development.

2. OFFICIAL DATES

From **June 21st to July 5th**

Total duration: 14 days

3. CAMP PRICE

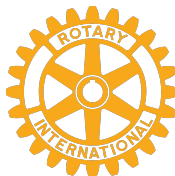
TOTAL COST: 1,600 € per participant

The price includes:

- All ground transportation within Spain
- Airport transfers (Madrid Barajas - Camp - Madrid Barajas)
- Accommodation with full board
- Laundry service (2 times per week)
- One official training kit
- One official leisure / walking outfit
- Common sports equipment
- Professional football training sessions
- Visits to football clubs and stadiums
- Cultural and educational activities

The price does NOT include:

- Proceedings to Madrid, (International flights)
- Insurance
- Visa costs (if required)
- Personal expenses
- Additional sportswear
- Atletico de Madrid and others visited clubs Official Jersey (available for purchase)



4. PARTICIPANT PROFILE

Age: 15 to 20 years old

Boys and girls

Good physical condition and fitness for intensive sports activity

Interest in football, teamwork, and multicultural exchange

Basic Spanish recommended (English support available)

5. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE LOGISTICS

Arrival June 21st

All participants will arrive at Madrid Barajas International Airport (MAD). A private charter bus organized by the camp will collect the group and transport them directly to the camp facilities, where they will stay for the full two weeks.

Departure July 5th

Participants will be transferred by private chartered bus from the camp facilities to Madrid-Barajas Airport for their return flights to their home countries.

This centralized transport system ensures maximum safety, coordination, and comfort for all international participants.

6. ACCOMMODATION AND FULL BOARD

Participants will stay at Colegio San José in Villafranca de los Barros, south west of Spain, in a fully equipped boarding school providing:

Comfortable accommodation

Full board (breakfast, lunch, snack, dinner)

Sports facilities and training fields

Swimming pool

Classrooms and indoor activity areas

Daily supervision

Safe and controlled environment

A laundry service will operate two times per week, collecting clothes and returning.

Due to high summer temperatures in Spain, **participants are strongly advised** to bring:

Light clothing

Several changes of sportswear

Appropriate footwear

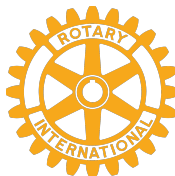
Training will not be allowed with dirty, damaged, or insufficient sports clothing.

7. LANGUAGE

Main working language: Spanish

Support language: English (staff available to assist non-Spanish speakers)





8. INSURANCE AND RESPONSIBILITY

Each participant must arrange the medical and accident insurance required by Rotary, as indicated by Multidistrict Spain.

Participants are responsible for obtaining visas if required.

Rotary Club Almendralejo holds valid civil liability insurance

Colegio San José holds institutional liability insurance.

Global Game (sports management company) holds professional and civil liability insurance.

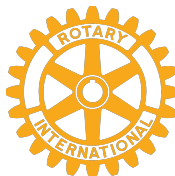

Evening educational talk after lunch

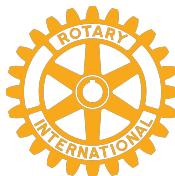

11. EQUIPMENT

Provided by the Camp:

- 1 leisure / walking outfit
- Common sports equipment

Participants must bring:

- Multiple sets of sports clothing
- Football boots
- Light clothing
- Personal hygiene items
- Sunscreen and personal medication

12. MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS

The maximum participants number is 55, with the possibility of expansion depending on demand and approval.

13. REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

Each participant must submit:

- Rotary STE Camp application (signed by sponsor club and district)
- Medical certificate (fit for intensive sports)
- Parental authorization
- Passport copy
- Insurance certificate
- Visa (if required)
- Code of Conduct agreement
- Certificate of Sexual Offences (only for the ones above 18)
- Emergency contact information
